**Housing Authority of the City of Fayetteville Arkansas** **\$277,320.00**

*(S+C – New Application) Ozark Guidance Center and the Housing Authority of the City of Fayetteville.* The sponsor for this new five-year Shelter Plus Care Grant is Ozark Guidance Center. The project involves ten units of tenant-based rental assistance. The population to be served is homeless, disabled individuals or families with a head-of-household diagnosed as seriously mentally ill. Participants must be accepted into *Ozark Guidance Center's* system of care as a condition of receiving rental assistance. This will give the participants the opportunity for stable housing within the community in conjunction with ongoing mental health services, including co-existing problems such as alcohol and/or drug abuse.

**Seven Hills Homeless Center** **\$94,500.00**

*(SHP – New Application) Seven Hills Homeless Shelter and the Ozark Guidance Center.* *Seven Hills Homeless Center* received grants for a combined transitional and permanent housing facility for homeless women and families in the 2003 CoC competition. They are currently in the process of constructing that facility. This 2004 new three-year SHP grant will allow them to partner with the sponsor, *Ozark Guidance Center*, which will use the grant

funds to provide supportive services to residents of the transitional and permanent housing. These services will be designed to address the obstacles to self-sufficiency that must be overcome if these individuals and families are to transition to healthy and stable lives.

**Benton County Women's Shelter**

**\$102,375.00**

(SHP – New Application) Benton County Women's Shelter. SHP new three-year transitional housing project for victims of domestic violence. This project will provide housing vouchers for six one- to three-bedroom rental apartment rental units for single women and women with up to five children to enable them to maintain a safe, independent lifestyle free from violence. During the time they're living in transitional housing, they will be assisted in gaining skills and income to enable them to move to permanent housing and self sufficiency.

**Youth Bridge, Inc.**

**\$341,427.00**

(SHP – New Application) Youth Bridge, Inc. SHP new three-year transitional housing program for young adults (18 to 22) coming out of emergency youth shelter programs where they have resided for at least 30 days and lacking the resources and support networks to obtain housing, and finding themselves homeless. The grantee reports that there were 45 youth from their emergency shelters alone in 2003-2004 that left the shelters without the resources or support networks to find housing. These youth were no longer able to be placed in foster care or were taken from their homes because of abuse and/or neglect or had been abandoned by their parents. This project will fill an important gap in this much needed service.
